

Welcome to the 2024 CSOTTE Conference! I am delighted that we have this opportunity to learn with and from one another. Educator preparation is challenging work. But it is also joyful work as we guide, prepare, and inspire upcoming public servants who will shape countless lives as teachers, school leaders, counselors, and other educators. We have a unique responsibility to ensure that educator preparation in Texas rigorously prepares aspiring teachers with the content and pedagogical skills to provide the highest-quality education to all PK-12 students. We have further responsibilities to build educator preparation pathways

that are accessible and supportive, to re-envision our programs in light of best evidence-based models, to engage in continuous improvement, to nurture strong partnerships with districts and external stakeholders, to advocate and plan for resources needed to achieve excellence in preparation and to value, honor, and support the many diverse communities of Texas in reaching their educational dreams.

Throughout her life, Maxine highlighted the necessity of **social imagination** as "the capacity to invent visions of what should be and what might be in our deficient society, on the streets where we live, in our schools." Maxine believed we can collectively create the equitable and life-giving schools and society our youth need.

As educators of educators, a social imagination empowers us to reach towards others in a public space, achieving a community that is forever incomplete. Social imagination points us to the arts as a resource for seeing what we have not yet seen and for viewing unexpected possibilities as we imagine a transformative education of excellence for all of Texas's more than 5.7 million students from many vibrant and diverse communities. Social imagination creates an opportunity for us, within the noble work of educator preparation, to remake "what it is that we may yet have in common" (Ahmed, 2000). It is absolutely critical that we engage well with the technical work of educator preparation and in leading programs that are accountable, effective, and evidence-based. It is likewise crucial that our work be inspired and motivated by a healing vision of "what might be" in our schools and society.

I am honored to work with each of you, grateful for your expertise and commitment to the highest-quality educator preparation, inspired by your support for one another and our Texas EPPs, and excited to see what we will all learn together.

Associate and Assistant Deans and Directors of Texas (ADoT)



Excellence in Action Award: Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Social Justice

The Excellence in Action: Diversity, Equity, Inclusion & Social Justice award was established to recognize programs or leaders who have impacted policy and/or practice in this area. Nominees are evaluated on evidence of their ability to: demonstrate a commitment to promoting diversity, equity, and inclusion through direct action; challenge others to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion and provide guidance, feedback, and support growth; promote a positive culture for ALL learners; and demonstrate a willingness to share expertise, knowledge, and commitment with others.

The 2024 recipient is Dr. Elizabeth Ward.

Excellence in Mentoring Award

The Excellence in Mentoring award has been established to recognize university faculty and/or staff, Texas P-12 classroom teachers, or school leaders who have demonstrated commitment to the development and advancement of others. The critical role of mentoring could be through either direct, supervisory, or peer-based roles. Nominees are evaluated on evidence about their ability to: demonstrate a holistic view of mentees through leadership that encourages and promotes excellence; challenge mentee(s) to take on difficult assignments while providing guidance, feedback, and support in all aspects of growth; promote a positive culture for learning, and demonstrate a willingness to share expertise, knowledge, and commitment with others.

The 2024 recipient is Dr. Helen Berg.

Distinguished Service Award

The Distinguished Service Award has been established to recognize and further encourage the achievements and contributions of current or former Associate and assistant Deans and Directors of Texas in the field of teacher preparation. Nominees must currently or formerly hold a position of Associate Dean, Assistant Dean, or Director within a Texas university-based educator preparation program and must have held one of these positions or a combination of these positions for at least three years.

Texas Association of Teacher Educators (TxATE)



Ted Booker Memorial Award

In 1971, Ted Booker, TSCTE President in 1969-1970 and Dean of the College of Education at Texas Woman's University, suggested that TSCTE (predecessor of TxATE) use surplus funds to establish an award for an outstanding contribution in the field of teacher education. Because of his leadership in this area, and his untimely death in 1971, the Ted Booker Memorial Award was established in April 1972 at the TSCTE Spring Conference.

Ben E. Coody Distinguished Service Award

Dr. Coody served as the last President of the Texas Association for Student Teaching before the association became the Texas Association of Teacher Educators in 1971. Shortly after completing his term as president, Dr. Coody met an untimely death in an automobile accident. He was respected for his high code of ethics, his professional zeal, and his sincerity of purpose. This award honors others who have provided significant service to the organization. Service to the profession through contributions to fieldwork or clinical practice is emphasized.

Quest for Quality Exceptional K-12 Partnerships Award

TXATE invites universities to nominate Exceptional K-12 School Partnerships such as Induction Programs or Continuing Professional Development initiatives that have been developed and implemented through their university teacher preparation programs. These practices are critically important to the success of university-based teacher education programs. Not only do they provide teacher candidates with opportunities to engage in the theory and practice of teaching in context, but they also link universities, teachers, schools and communities in a common goal of improving learning for all children. Partnerships may involve a single or multiple schools, school districts, and the university. They may take a variety of forms to reflect specific partnership activities and approaches with the goal of improving both teacher preparation and K-12 schools.

TACTE Annual Leadership Award

The TACTE Leadership Award is presented annually to someone who has demonstrated outstanding leadership in the organization and who is deserving of TACTE recognition for significant contributions to the educator preparation process in Texas.

Robert B. Howsam Award

Robert B. Howsam, who was a former Dean of the College of Education at the University of Houston, was an acknowledged leader in education for many years and enjoyed a national and international reputation. He was best known for his advocacy of competency-based teacher education, his dynamic leadership as a dean, and for his commitment to excellence in the preparation of educational professionals in Texas and the nation.

Friend of Teacher Education Award


